## Sports Premium Funding Statement

### What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport; and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

### Purpose of the funding

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport but there is freedom to choose how we spend it. At Newcomen Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of our children. In addition we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum alongside extra-curricular opportunities enhances the concentration and attitude of our pupils resulting in even greater academic achievement.
